Good morning, The treatment of our fly ash is described in our answer to question #3 below: Fly ash that is sent away for disposal includes three main components, besides fly ash: (1) cement, (2) pozzolan, and (3) water. We mix these reagents with the fly ash to micro-encapsulate the material, essentially turning the hazardous fly ash into an inert cement-like material. For instance, will the facility combust pressure treated lumber, CCA, CA etc.? Thanks,	Good afternoon, Thank you for your interest in the Durham York Energy Centre (DYEC). The DYECs Environmental Compliance Approval allows us to accept only waste which has been collected at the curbside within Durham and York Regions only, after compost and recycling efforts, and through regionally owned drop off transfer stations. Some of the construction waste from small residential projects brought to the transfer stations includes pressure treated lumber. Our fuel consists of mixed waste materials.
